Communion

Our meal of bread and wine was started long ago. Each time we gather, we remember what it means to us. At important Jewish meals, a young person asks questions about what the family is going to do. Today, one of our children will ask questions about the family meal we share in Jesus 'name:

Child: What are we going to do at this table? First, we will say a prayer to thank God for everything God has given us. Then, we will break a loaf of bread in pieces and pass the pieces around the whole church so everyone who wants to can have a taste. We will pass these cups of wine around the whole church, too, so everyone who wants to can have a drink.



Child: Why do we share bread and wine? We share bread and wine today because Jesus shared bread and wine with his friends long ago. It was the same night when Jesus was arrested, on the night before he died. That night he asked his friends to keep sharing bread and wine to remember him. Child: But I wasn't there with Jesus. What should I remember? When you take a bit of bread, you should remember that Jesus lived a life like yours. He shared bread with his friends and with everyone who needed it. When you drink the wine, you should remember that Jesus died because he loves you.

He died to promise you that God's love is so powerful, there is nothing to be afraid of, not even dying. So when we take this bread and this wine,



Let us give thanks together:

Jesus said, 'I am the Bread of Life'. Take this to remember me.


These are the gifts of God for you. Taste and see that God is good.
