- Knife Angel (content borrowed from St Mary's website)



The Knife Angel has arrived in Haverhill, and this month's programme of activities and events was launched with a poignant opening ceremony on Wednesday. We heard from those involved in tackling violence and crime, as well as from the family of the late Harley Barfield, who was killed at the beginning of last year.

St Mary's [website](#) is being kept up to date with all the activities and events on offer from the churches. In particular, if you heard the Revd Kiran Lotay's performance last night of his original rap music, and would like to hear more and speak to him about his work, then you may be interested in coming along on Monday 16th September at 4pm. Sign up for free tickets [online](#).

Here are some of the ways you can join in over the month:

- See the **art exhibition** at St Mary's from prisoners at HMP Highpoint, including some poignant responses to violent crime from those who have been directly involved or affected.
- Use the **prayer station** at St Mary's to reflect on your experience of the Knife Angel and to offer to God any particular people or places on your heart.
- Write in the **book of remembrance** at St Mary's if you know someone who has been lost to acts of violence, or in response to events that affect the whole community.
- Speak to one of the many **local community groups** offering advice and support, including Open Mind who are on Market Square every Saturday during September.
- Follow the monthly **bible study** from St Mary's, looking at responses to violence, available [online](#).
- Fill in an **anti-violence pledge** on a wooden heart and leave it at the railings surrounding the Knife Angel.

There are various services and events happening throughout the month

including:

- Monday **16th September** at 4pm: performance of original rap music from Suffolk artist the Revd Kiran Lotay, in St Mary's Church.
- Saturday **21st September** at 2pm: our Messy Church service for primary schoolchildren looks at forgiveness, in St Mary's Church.
- Wednesday **25th September** at 8pm (tbc): vigil service with music from St Mary's choir, in Market Square.
- Friday **27th September**: Civic Closing Ceremony, in Market Square.
- Sunday **29th September** at 11am: in-person bible study on responding to violence, in St Mary's Church.
- Monday **30th September**: Knife Angel leaves Market Square for Peterborough.

St Mary's will be open regularly at the following times to make use of the opportunities inside the building, and at other times by request or for particular services, events and workshops:

- Sundays 10-12/Wednesdays 10-12/Fridays 10-4/Saturdays 10-2

This is a unique opportunity to come together as a community in response to rising concerns about youth violence and knife crime.. We have already sadly seen the effects of knife crime first hand in Haverhill, and so our hope and prayer is to encourage everyone - and young people in particular - to recognise the damage that acts of violence can cause, and to be moved to respond to one another in peace.

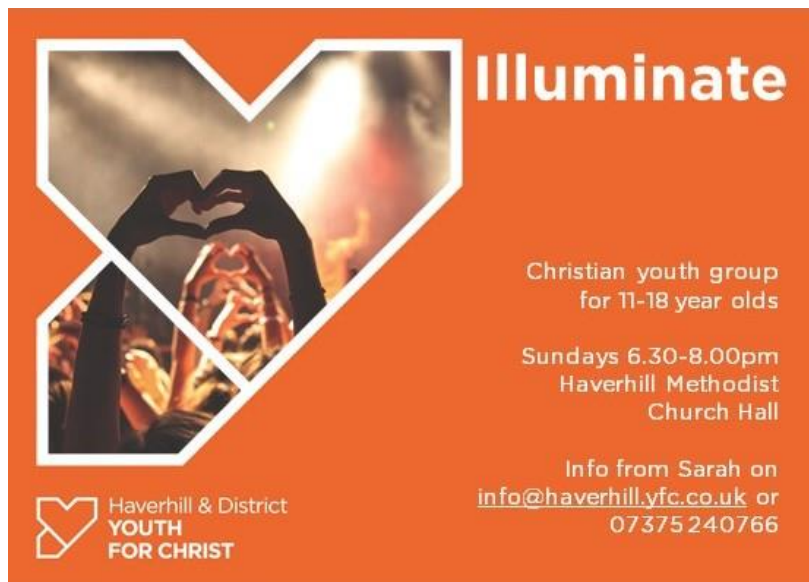

Illuminate is a Christian youth group welcoming local young people from any church or none.

It is run by Haverhill & District Youth for Christ with volunteer leaders from a variety of churches.

The aim is to develop our faith and relationship with Jesus, make friends, invite friends, study the Bible and pray together and discuss relevant life topics from a Christian perspective.

There is always fun to be had with games, activities, tuck shop and social events.

A typical evening will start with some free time to chat, play football and buy sweets. We then explore our topic in bite size activities like discussions, games, prayer spaces, Bible studies and creative activities.

We love to hear what everyone has to say, but there is no pressure. The groups is at it's best when the young people come up with ideas and we support them to make it happen.

Our group is very friendly and we would love to see some old faces returning as well as new.

Feedback is always welcome, and we are seeing if we can create a separate group for those in school years 10-13.

• Your Church needs You !

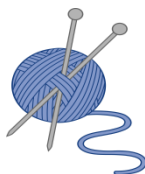

- The Role of Pastoral Friend at Haverhill Methodist Church

1. To offer friendship, caring support and encouragement particularly in times of special need.
2. To keep in contact with those you are a pastoral friend to. This contact
3. may happen through Sunday worship, home visits, telephone conversations, email or text or letters/cards.
4. To pray for and perhaps with those you are a pastoral friend to.
5. To make available our weekly Connect to those unable to access it.
6. To distribute the annual Methodist Church Membership Tickets and Adherent Tickets.
7. As appropriate, to inform the Pastoral Secretary and Church Minister of any serious illness, hospitalisation or if back up support is needed.
8. To inform the Safeguarding Officer of any concerns
9. To inform the Pastoral Secretary and Communication Team Leader of any changes in their contact details.
10. To attend Pastoral Meeting.

- Weekly Offering & Gift Aid



We do not ask visitors for money, however should you wish to give there is an offering bowl just inside the main doors to the church at each service. If you wish to give by standing order/online banking, please ask the duty steward (wearing a purple lanyard) for details of the appropriate church bank account. (This type of payment helps us avoid banking costs incurred by paying in cash/cheques.)

If you pay income tax you can fill in a form which allows the church to claim back 25p for every £1 at no cost to yourself. These forms are available from the duty steward on a Sunday morning.

The amount claimed back in recent years has approached £10,000 pa and has often prevented expenditure exceeding income in the annual accounts.
