• <u>Posada</u>

The idea of a Posada comes originally from Central America, probably from Mexico and may go back to the late 16th century. The word 'posada' means 'inn' or 'shelter' in Spanish.

The idea is to use the time of Advent when we prepare for Christ's coming at Christmas, to welcome Mary and Joseph into our homes and remember the time they were trying to find a place for Jesus to be born in Bethlehem.

There is a Posada set (basically a manger scene) which travels around the congregation, moving to a new home each day. Members of the congregation sign up for a day when they can receive the Posada which will be brought to them by the household that precedes them on the list. They will welcome the visitors, provide simple refreshments (tea/coffee + biscuits/cake) and then hold a short act of worship (words provided). The display is usually placed in the window and will be taken to the next household on the list the following day, a suitable time having been agreed. Eventually the Posada is brought to the Church for the Christmas morning service when we all, as a community, welcome Mary, Joseph and Jesus into our lives.

The Posada has perhaps added significance today as we think of the millions of refugees throughout the world who are seeking a safe place to stay.

• Regular Church Bookings

There have been a few changes to those groups who regularly use the hall/loft/coffee lounge/church – please refer to the Regular Hall Hirers on the notice boards, in the hall, foyer of church, notice board downstairs. Please always check with Mick Etheridge if you wish to use parts of the premises as there could be odd bookings apart from the regular ones.

Weekly Offering & Gift Aid

We do not ask visitors for money, however should you wish to give there is an offering bowl just inside the main doors to the church at each service. If you wish to give by standing order/onlinebanking, please ask the duty steward (wearing a purple lanyard) for details of the appropriate church bank account. (This type of payment helps us avoid banking costs incurred by paying in cash/cheques.)

If you pay income tax you can fill in a form which allows the church to claim back 25p for every £1 at no cost to yourself. These forms are available from the duty steward on a Sunday morning.

The amount claimed back in recent years has approached £10,000 pa and has often prevented expenditure exceeding income in the annual accounts.



Advent is the season leading up to Christmas. It is 24 days of preparation. This year, we're inviting you to prepare by looking for the visual reminders of God's presence... daily.


