• The Nicene Creed - 1700 Years Old

The Nicene Creed is recited by Christians of all denominations world-wide. We use it throughout the year at our monthly Eucharist at Withersfield, and on Sundays



in Eastertide at Haverhill. It is a statement of our faith in God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The first draft was agreed at a council of bishops in 325, presided over by the Roman Emperor Constantine, in Nicaea in Türkiye. This was a critical



moment in the church's history, when leaders of the church were able to discuss openly the fundamentals of our faith. The words which we still use today have been spoken in one form or another by Christians for the last 1700 years.

"We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen."

A prayer for the unity of the Church, built on the faith described in the Nicene Creed:

Almighty God, you have called your church to give voice to the truth of your saving power in the words of the Nicene Creed: grant that we may always believe in you, our one Lord and Saviour, acknowledge your presence in the world today, and look for the signs of your coming kingdom, together with all the faithful of every age; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

• Update from REACH – *Together, Giving Hope*



Thank you for your amazing support for local people Community Projects across our community. Many who have lost hope. Together, we really can

make a difference.

Apologies for not being able to be present this evening, but here is a brief snapshot on what is happening at REACH.

The big news for us is the launch of our 'Welcome Spaces' from the beginning of February. Essentially, and having listened to our visitors, we

have merged the former 'drop-ins' and 'food collection points' into one afternoon session from 2-4pm at different locations across the town. Mondays – The Link

Tuesdays – West Suffolk College (the old Provincial/AXA building in the High Street)

Wednesdays – Chalkstone Community Centre Thursdays – Haverhill Methodist Church Hall Fridays – St Mary's Church In other news...

The foodbank continues to see many requests for emergency food. Overall, we are seeing a rough increase of around 4% of people needing food parcels compared to last year. However, the amount of food coming in is still in decline compared to what it was over the last few years. That said, we are managing stock levels and are not struggling to meet the increased need – mostly down to a good harvest and Christmas food donations. It may get trickier as the year goes on.

The Community Advice Team made up of debt advisors and income maximisation advisors (IMA) are very busy. The debt numbers are still very high, but we are managing to meet a client within 3-4 weeks but sometimes varies. Overall, the numbers of people needing debt help is as high as it's ever been! E.g., for the first 4 months of our financial year, (October to January) we opened 124 debt cases compared to 76 for the same period last year! It remains very tough out there.

On a very positive note, the IMA team continue addressing one of our primary objectives – that is to put 'Pounds in Pockets'. For example, when someone comes to us for emergency food etc., we will often see if there is any additional support such as government benefit help, utility help, broadband (this is called maximising the person's income).

For example – a 72-year-old lady called us for the first time ever in November, she needed an emergency food box. She told us that she needed to collect the food from St Mary's on the Friday

because of mobility issues. However, it was Tuesday, but she had '2 tins of soup' to tie her over until then, so she said she could wait! No surprises, but we delivered food that afternoon!

An appointment was made for a week later for Ann from the IMA team to visit her at her home. An application was made for Attendance Allowance and just after Christmas she started to receive an additional £72 per week (i.e., that's a financial gain in our world of £3,744 p/a which is £72 x 52 weeks). She is a very happy lady and no longer needs to make calls to the foodbank!

In total, the amount of financial gain recovered for local people from October 2024 to the end of January amounts to £261,312 in benefits reclaimed alone!

Sadly, so many people are not claiming what they are entitled to, this includes Universal Credit through to Child Benefit even!

One more story: A couple who are of pensionable age, called us when they heard that the Winter Fuel Allowance (WFA) could only be claimed by those on Pension Credit. They called us at REACH to see if we could help. Helen, another from the IMA team visited, carried out the calculations only to discover that they did not qualify for Pension Credit – by just 75 pence! Undeterred, Helen made several enquiries and discovered that they were entitled to cheaper water, a council tax reduction and Attendance Allowance. By November last year, when they should have been expecting their WFA, they were now receiving a further £500 per month in unclaimed benefits!

It's fair to say, that this couple would never have contacted us, but as a couple that were 'just about managing' did make the call and discovered that there were a number of things that they were entitled too, but they, like many other people across our community, just didn't know about! We have many more stories of families that together, we have helped and are so grateful to everyone for their support both in terms of prayer, food, finances and of course, volunteering hours! We really couldn't do this without the amazing support of the community.



• Car Park

The car park has recently been very congested and a few folk were unable to move their cars after the service as they were blocked in. When parking please:

- > Do not block other cars in the car park
- > Do not park on the double yellow lines in front of the coffee lounge
- Do not park at the entry to the church between the church and next door.

Note: the car park by the council offices/library is free on Sundays and is only a short walk away.

• Weekly Offering & Gift Aid

We do not ask visitors for money, however should you wish to give there is an offering bowl just inside the main doors to the church at each service. If you wish to give by standing order/onlinebanking, please ask the duty steward (wearing a purple lanyard) for details of the appropriate church bank account. (This type of payment helps us avoid banking costs incurred by paying in cash/cheques.)

If you pay income tax you can fill in a form which allows the church to claim back 25p for every £1 at no cost to yourself. These forms are available from the duty steward on a Sunday morning.

The amount claimed back in recent years has approached £10,000 pa and has often prevented expenditure exceeding income in the annual accounts.
